Dates in History

- On December 25th, General George 1776 Washington led 2,400 troops on a daring nighttime crossing of the Delaware river allowing the continental army to launch a successful surprise attack on British forces in New Jersey. Washington's crossing of the frozen Delaware was a crucial rallying cry for the continental army.
- On December 2nd, in Notre Dame Cathedral 1804 in Paris, Napoleon Bonaparte was crowned Napoleon I, the first Frenchman to hold the title of emperor in a thousand years. Pope Pius VII handed Napoleon the crown that the 35-year-old conqueror of Europe placed on his own head.
- On December 10th, the first Nobel Prizes 1901 were awarded in Stockholm, Sweden, in the fields of physics, chemistry, medicine, literature, and peace. The ceremony came on the fifth anniversary of the death of Alfred Nobel, the Swedish inventor of dynamite and other high explosives. In his will. Nobel directed that the bulk of his vast fortune be placed in a fund in which the interest would be "annually distributed in the form of prizes to those who, during the preceding year, shall have conferred the greatest benefit on mankind."

On December 17th, near Kitty Hawk, North 1903 Carolina, Orville and Wilbur Wright made the first successful flight in history of a selfpropelled, heavier-than-air aircraft.

On December 28th, president Richard 1973 Nixon signed the Endangered Species Act into law. The act, which Nixon called for the previous year, is considered one of the most significant and influential environmental laws in American history.
