1775 On April 18th, Paul Revere, a renowned silversmith, better remembered as a folk hero of the American Revolution, during the night made a dramatic ride on horseback to warn Boston-area residents of an imminent attack by British troops.

On April 24th, the Library of Congress was 1800 officially founded as U.S. President John Adams approved the \$5,000 appropriated to acquire "such books as may be necessary for the use of congress." It eventually became the largest library in the world.

On April 3rd, the first pony express mail, 1860 traveling by horse and rider relay teams, simultaneously left St. Joseph, Missouri, and Sacramento, California. Ten days later, on April 13th, the westbound rider and mail packet completed the approximately 1,800mile journey and arrived in Sacramento, beating the eastbound packet's arrival in St. Joseph by two days and setting a new standard for speed mail delivery.

On April 16th, American aviator Harriet 1912 Quimby became the first woman to fly across the English Channel, guiding her French Blériot monoplane through heavy overcast from Dover, England to Hardelot, France.

1970 On April 22nd, millions of Americans celebrated the very first Earth Day in the United States. The first Earth Day increased environmental awareness in America, and in July of 1970, the Environmental Protection Agency was established by executive order to regulate and enforce national pollution legislation.
