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Dates in History

On January 1st, regular mail delivery began between New York and Boston. The General Court of Massachusetts designated Richard Fairbanks' tavern in Boston as the official site of mail delivery going to or coming from overseas as most correspondence was between colonists and family back in England. In 1673, New York's Governor Francis Lovelace set up a monthly horseback post between New York and Boston. Old Boston Post Road is part of today's Route 1.

As the father of modern taxonomy, Carolus Linnaeus defined the principles for grouping, ranking and naming organisms on January 1.

Also called binomial nomenclature (or Latin name) the first part of the name identifies the genus to which the species belongs and the second part of the name identifies the species within the genus.

1801 The dwarf planet Ceres was discovered by Italian monk Giuseppe Piazzi on January 1. Dwarf planet Ceres is the largest object in the asteroid belt between Mars and Jupiter and the only dwarf planet located in the inner solar system.
