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Dates in History

- On March 13th, English astronomer William Herschel observed the seventh planet from the Sun, Uranus—first described by him as "a curious either nebulous star or perhaps a comet" and named for the father of the god Saturn.
- Indoor ice hockey made its public debut 1875 in Montreal, Quebec on March 3rd. After weeks of training at the Victoria Skating Rink with his friends, Montreal resident James Creighton advertised in the March 3 edition of the Montreal Gazette that "A game of hockey will be played in the Victoria Skating Rink this evening between two nines chosen from among the members."
- 1889 The Eiffel Tower was dedicated on March 31st in Paris in a ceremony presided over by Gustave Eiffel, the tower's designer, and attended by French Prime Minister Pierre Tirard, a handful of other dignitaries, and 200 construction workers. To honor the centenary of the French Revolution, the French government planned an international exposition and announced a design competition for a monument to be built on the Champ-de-Mars in central Paris.
- 1963 The U.S. federal prison on San Francisco Bay's Alcatraz Island, which had held some of the most dangerous civilian prisoners including Al Capone and Robert Stroud, the "Birdman of Alcatraz"—was closed on March 21st.
- On March 2nd, Pioneer 10, the world's first outer-planetary probe, was launched from Cape Canaveral, Florida, on a mission to Jupiter, the solar system's largest planet.
